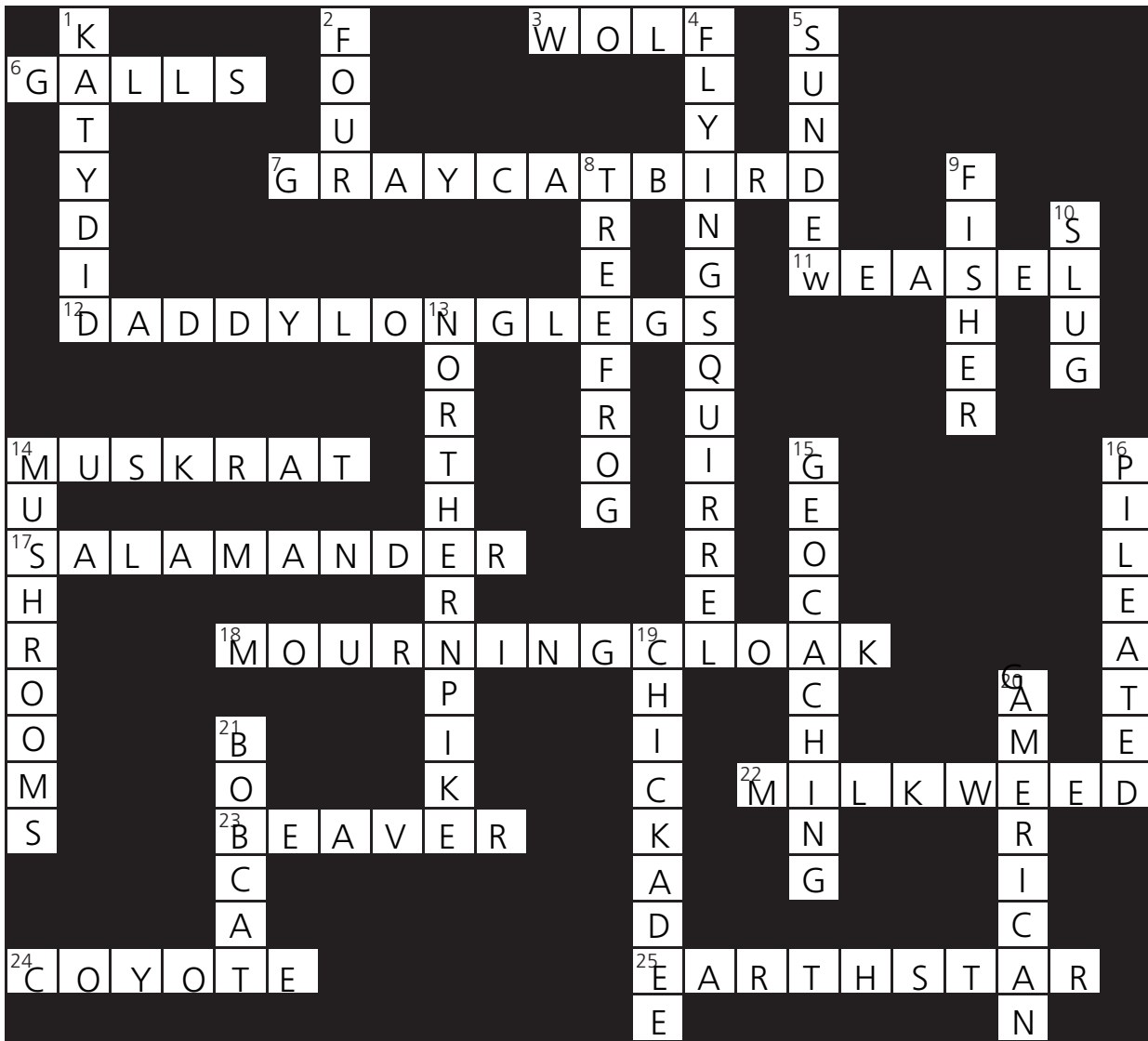




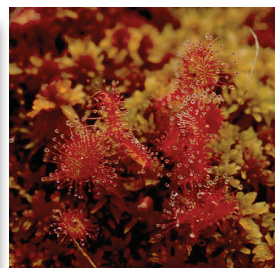
## North Woods Delight Fun Page

### Across

3. \_\_\_\_ spiders run down their prey much like the mammal that they are named after.
6. These ball like growths appear on various plants. Many are caused by insects (plural).
7. A bird that can mimic many sounds. The last sound it makes in its series of calls is a "meow" - giving it its name. (2 wds.)
11. These long predators can change colors in the winter turning from brown to white to blend in with the snow.
12. Another name for a harvestman, a small arachnid that looks like a spider but is not. (2 wds.)
14. This mammal that resembles a small beaver with a round tail sometimes shares a home with beavers.
17. An amphibian with four legs and a long tail.
18. One of the first butterflies to come out in the spring (2 wds.). Clues: First word - grieve for the dead, second word - a type of coat.
22. Food for monarch caterpillars.
23. At night, you may be able to hear this animal chewing on wood from a long distance.
24. A smaller relative of number three across.
25. This fungi, shaped like a flower.

1. These insects, that look like grasshoppers, have ears in their knees.
2. Number of mosquitoes found in the snapping turtle picture. (Page 11)
4. This nocturnal squirrel does not fly, it glides. (2 wds.)
5. A carnivorous plant found at Seney NWR. Their small leaves look like they have drops of water stuck to them.
8. A kind of frog that lives in a tree.
9. This mammal in the weasel family has a varied diet and is one of the few animals that can kill and eat a porcupine. Although its diet is mainly terrestrial, its name suggests it has more in common with anglers.
10. A small slimy animal usually found under rotting leaves.
13. Although there is a state size limit on these fish, Seney has none. (2 wds.)
14. Not only fish have gills, some of these do as well. (plural)
15. An activity which uses GPS can be done at Seney NWR. Clues can be found on the website.
16. The largest woodpecker in the north woods.
19. These small birds, which say their name, are common visitors to backyard feeders.
20. The only toad found at Seney NWR.
21. This predator is named for its short tail.
