11. CONDITIONS AND AUTHORIZATIONS:

A. GENERAL CONDITIONS SET OUT IN SUBPART D OF 50 CFR 13, AND SPECIFIC CONDITIONS CONTAINED IN FEDERAL REGULATIONS CITED IN BLOCK #2 ABOVE, ARE HEREBY MADE A PART OF THIS PERMIT. ALL ACTIVITIES AUTHORIZED HEREIN MUST BE CARRIED OUT IN ACCORD WITH AND FOR THE PURPOSES DESCRIBED IN THE APPLICATION SUBMITTED. CONTINUED VALIDITY, OR RENEWAL, OF THIS PERMIT IS SUBJECT TO COMPLETE AND TIMELY COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE CONDITIONS, INCLUDING THE FILING OF ALL REQUIRED INFORMATION AND REPORTS.

B. THE VALIDITY OF THIS PERMIT IS ALSO CONDITIONED UPON STRICT OBSERVANCE OF ALL APPLICABLE FOREIGN, STATE, LOCAL OR OTHER FEDERAL LAW.

C. VALID FOR USE BY PERMITTEE NAMED ABOVE.

D. Subpermittee authority: Service personnel and individuals under the direct control of Service personnel may conduct activities under this permit in the course of official duties.

E. Anyone conducting activities authorized by this permit must comply with the terms and conditions of the permit. Failure to comply with any conditions of the permit could be cause for its suspension.

F. Pursuant to the Migratory Bird Treaty Act and implementing regulations, you are authorized to conduct the following activities in the course of official duties:

- (1) Salvage dead migratory birds, including inactive nests and infertile eggs, for official purposes, donation to a public scientific institution, or for disposal, PROVIDED that any salvaged dead bald or golden eagles must be sent to the National Eagle Repository (Rocky Mountain Arsenal, Building 128, Commerce City, CO 80022 (telephone 303/287-2110);
- (2) Transport to a federally permitted migratory bird rehabilitator, or euthanize sick, injured, or orphaned birds; and
- (3) Possess dead migratory birds (except eagles) for educational purposes.

IF THIS CONDITION IS INCLUDED, PERMIT TENURE IS LIMITED TO 1 YEAR.] You are not authorized to take uninjured, healthy birds, or active nests with eggs or young, EXCEPT that you may, in emergency situations only, take, per incident, no more than 2 adult migratory birds and 2 active

migratory bird nests with eggs or young (excluding bald and golden eagles and mute swans) when the migratory birds, nests or eggs are posing a direct threat to human health or safety. A direct threat to **human health** is one where a federal, state, or local public health agency recommends removal of migratory birds posing an immediate, specific threat to human health when conditions it deems conducive to the transmission of human or zoonotic pathogens are created or found. A direct threat to **human safety** is one which involves a threat of serious bodily injury or a risk to human life. You may not use this authority for situations in which migratory birds are merely causing a nuisance. You must report any emergency take activity to your issuing office (insert issuing office location and phone number) within 72 hours after the emergency take action. Your report must include the species and number of birds taken, location (town, county, and state), method, and a complete description of the circumstances warranting the emergency action. You and any subpermittees must comply with the attached Standard Conditions for Migratory Bird Depredation Permits

- H. [NOTE TO ISSUER: OPTIONAL PROVISION ONLY IF SPECIFICALLY REQUESTED BY APPLICANT. DELETE IF NOT APPLICABLE. PERMIT TYPE SPMSIE (or SPMSDI, or SPMDIP, depending on the authorities granted).] **Export/import:** You are authorized to export and import migratory birds, including carcasses, parts, feathers, blood, tissue, nests, and eggs obtained under this permit, a scientific collecting permit (50 CFR 21.23), or a bird banding permit (50 CFR 21.22), **PROVIDED:**
- (1) You may not transport bald or golden eagles in or out of the United States without additional specific authorization under the Bald and Golden Eagle Act from your issuing office;
  - (2) You may not import or export species listed under the U.S. Endangered Species Act (50 CFR 17.11) or the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (50 CFR 23.23) without specific authorization under those laws;
  - (3) You must notify the Wildlife Inspector at the port of import or export at least 48 hours prior to the import/export; and
  - (4) You and any subpermittees must also comply with the attached Migratory Bird Import/Export Standard Conditions.
- I. All personnel exercising the authority of this permit must carry a legible copy of the permit when engaging in the permitted activities and maintain records of activities conducted.
- J. You must report annually any activities involving take of live birds, including euthanasia and relocation, to your issuing Migratory Bird Permit Office, via a consolidated report through the **[REGION 1 ONLY: California-Nevada Office or the]** Assistant Regional Director responsible for the programs operating under the permit.
