His current interests are in long-term monitoring of early life ecology of Klamath suckers, effects of weather and climate on Upper Klamath Lake fishes, and evolution of Oregon fishes. Recent publications on Klamath Basin fishes concern larval advection and marshes, juvenile sucker food habits, sucker genetics and taxonomy, impacts of exotic fish, ageing suckers and identification of larval Klamath minnows. He has recently served on recovery, advisory or review panels for Crater Lake bull trout and limnology, Devils Hole pupfish, Crescent Lake fisheries, Miller Lake lamprey, Umpqua Chub, Oregon chub, and Klamath Basin suckers.
