Conducted or administered numerous studies on life history, status and habitat requirements of the endangered Lost River and shortnose suckers in the Klamath Basin since 1986. As a biologist for Reclamation, helped prepare several biological assessments on the effects of the Klamath Irrigation Project on endangered suckers to comply with the ESA. With the US Fish and Wildlife Service, participated on the Hatfield Working Group Science Team in developing a short-term ecosystem restoration plan for the Upper Klamath Basin, assisted with development of the 2008 Klamath Irrigation Project biological opinion, and supervised a habitat restoration program monitoring program.
