Two Rivers Unit, Peninsula Unit, and Villard Ponds



General Regulations

Days/Hours - The **Two Rivers, Peninsula and Villard Ponds Units** are open to the public for waterfowl and upland game hunting seven days a week in accordance with State regulations.

Parking - Park only in designated parking areas.

Vehicular Travel - Vehicles/Bicycles are restricted to designated routes of travel and parking areas.

Horseback riding - Horseback riding is permitted on designated horse trails between July 15 and October 1.

Dogs/Pets - Dogs and other pets must be kept on a leash except during the lawful pursuit of game during legal seasons.

Prohibited Activities - Fires, camping, artifact collecting, **ATVs, and other off-road vehicles are prohibited.** The possession and discharging of firearms is prohibited except during the lawful pursuit of game during legal seasons.

Hunting Regulations

Hunting is permitted in accordance with all applicable State regulations and special refuge regulations.

Weapons, shot, and shells - Only shotguns and bow and arrows are permitted.

Upland Game Bird Hunting

Two Rivers Unit - Only non-toxic shot may be used or possessed during upland game bird hunting.

Peninsula Unit - We prohibit upland game hunting before **12:00 noon** on goose hunt days. Only non-toxic shot may be used or possessed.

Waterfowl Hunting

Two Rivers Unit & Villard Ponds - Waterfowl hunting is permitted in accordance with State regulations. Temporary blinds are permitted. Permanent blinds are not permitted. Hunting parties must space themselves at least 200 yards (180m) apart.

Casey Pond - Due to the expansion of Highway 12, Casey Pond has only two designated waterfowl hunting sites (see map). Hunt only from these two designated sites.

Peninsula Unit - Hunting on the east shoreline and islands is only from posted sites 1 – 12. Hunters must hunt from within 100 feet (30m) of these posted sites. Hunting is on a first come-first served basis. **Shoreline hunting site #11 is designated as a disabled hunters blind.** Disabled hunters have priority use of this blind and should contact the refuge manager regarding blind access.

Hunting on the west side shoreline of the Peninsula Unit is free roam. Hunting parties must space themselves at least 200 yards (180m) apart.

Hunters using goose pits must register at the Unit's entrance off Hanson Loop Road. Registration is permitted no earlier than 6:00 PM the day before the hunt. Hunters registering for the pits must move the registration tag corresponding to the pit number selected to the "Pit in Use" row. At the conclusion of the hunt, the tag must be moved back to the "Pit Available" row.
