The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (Department) and the Cornell FFA Chapter (Adopter) recognize the need and the importance of providing public shooting ranges. To fulfill this need, the Adopter hereby agrees to perform volunteer services as at the following shooting range:

The agreement is effective beginning when range construction is completed and ending January 1, 2012 .

2. Provide volunteer services to maintain the shooting range, including mowing grass, maintain shooting benches, maintain and replace back-stops, monitor and replace posted signs/regulations, and report hazards or unsafe conditions to the Department conservation warden.
3. Abide by the Adopt-A-Shooting Range Program Terms & Condition
4. Additional duties may be agreed upon as follows:
Cornell FFA Chapter agrees to provide labor only.

- 2. Provide land for the shooting range.
- 3. Complete the design and construction a 100-yard shooting range. A Department engineer or consultant will complete the design and construct the range to nationally recognized shooting range standards. The Department may incorporate other shooting sport facilities in the design as agreed upon by both the Department and the Adopter. The Department may develop other facilities near the shooting range as long as they don't interfere with the range.
- 4. Inspect the facility twice per year per s. 23.115 Stats. The Adopter will be invited to accompany the conservation warden on the inspection.
- 5. Provide recognition of the Adopter's volunteer efforts, including a sign at the facility and a press release when range construction begins and when the range is opened to the public.
- 6. Provide a sign indicating mutually acceptable dates and hours when the range is open to the public. Note: the Department encourages having the range open every day from sunrise to sunset.

Either the Adopter or the Department at any time may cancel this agreement while in effect.
