

# Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge

## ~2009-10~ Hunting Fact Sheet

Public hunting for deer is allowed on Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge **by Refuge permit only**. Details about both gun and archery hunting are listed below.

### 2009 Gun Season



Number of permits available: 45. **Permits will be awarded by a random drawing to be held on October 13, 2009.** Up to two hunters may apply on one application. Hunters must be at least 12 years of age. If your application is drawn, both hunters will receive a permit. **You may only apply ONE TIME. Multiple applications with duplicate names will be discarded.**

**Dates:** November 21, 2009 through November 29, 2009

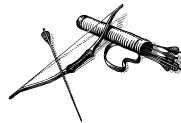
**Season Limit:** One deer per Refuge Permit of either sex may be taken during the Gun deer season from November 21 through November 29, 2009. Hunters must have appropriate state tags for the deer that they harvest.

**Closed Areas:** Black Oak Island, and the ends of Delta Dike and Oxbow Dike.

**Deadline to turn in application:** **October 9, 2009**

**Fee:** Each hunter selected in the random drawing will pay a **\$10.00** fee.

### 2009-10 Late Archery Season



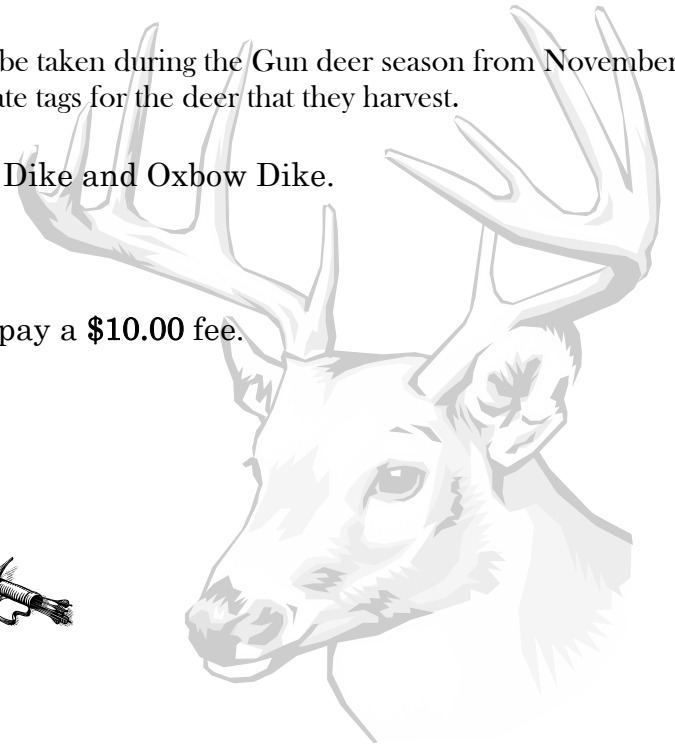
**Dates:** November 30, 2009 through January 3, 2010

**Season Limit:** One deer per Refuge Permit of either sex may be taken during the Late Archery deer season from November 30, 2009 through January 3, 2010. Hunters must have appropriate state tags for the deer that they harvest.

**Closed Areas:** Black Oak Island, and the ends of Delta Dike and Oxbow Dike.

**Deadline:** Permits are available from **September 1, 2009 through December 18, 2009.**

**Fee:** Archery hunters will pay a **\$10.00** fee when they turn in their application. Checks should be made out to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.



## Special Conditions and Additional Information for Refuge Gun/Archery Hunt

- ❖ **All Wisconsin State regulations are in effect. All participants are required to have Wisconsin licenses and proper stamps when necessary.**
- ❖ **Season** - See above for details on gun and archery. The Refuge is open for access from 1 hour before until 1 hour after legal shooting times during the deer season only. Other times the Refuge is open **DURING DAYLIGHT HOURS ONLY.**
- ❖ **Hunting areas** - Trempealeau National Wildlife Refuge as shown on the map. **Black Oak Island and the ends of Oxbow Dike and Delta Dike are closed to hunting!**
- ❖ **Limit** - **ONE DEER MAY BE TAKEN UPON ISSUANCE OF A REFUGE PERMIT.** Hunters must have appropriate state tags for the deer that they take. Please see the 2008 Wisconsin Deer Hunting Regulations.
- ❖ **Weapons** - Shotgun, muzzle loader, handgun, or bows per state regulations. Rifles are *not* permitted.
- ❖ **Who May Hunt** - **Only those people who have been issued a special permit from the Refuge.** The Refuge will not be participating in the Hunting Mentorship Program at this time. All hunters must be at least 12 years old. Hunters less than 18 years of age who receive a permit must be accompanied by a parent or guardian; adults must have a Refuge permit if they possess a firearm while on the Refuge.
- ❖ **Deer registration** - On opening weekend of gun season and from 7:30 am to 4:00 pm during the week you may register your deer at the Refuge maintenance building. **All hunters must complete a special harvest report form and return it to the Refuge, either by mail or at the reporting box on the maintenance facility gate to be eligible for future hunting permits. Failure to report deer harvest forms will result in “no hunting” privileges in future years, even if you do not harvest a deer.**
- ❖ **Tree Stands** - Portable-type stands only; these must be removed from the Refuge at the end of each hunting day.
- ❖ **Roads and Buildings** - Hunting is prohibited within 50 feet of the center of any Refuge road open to public vehicles. Discharging a firearm is prohibited from or across any Refuge road open to public vehicles, or within 50 feet of the road's center. These prohibitions do not apply to Refuge roads that are *closed to public vehicles*, including roads located behind locked gates and/or signs stating "Authorized Vehicles Only". Shooting a firearm is prohibited within 100 yards of any Refuge building.
- ❖ **Alcohol** - The use or possession of alcoholic beverages while hunting is prohibited.
- ❖ **Driving** - Driving of deer is permitted only after 12:00pm (noon) each day.
- ❖ **Baiting** - The distribution of or hunting over bait is not permitted.
- ❖ **Safety** - Non-hunters may be on the Refuge during the hunt! **Be sure of your target!**

## 2009 Waterfowl Hunting for Hunters with Disabilities

Waterfowl hunting opportunities for hunters with disabilities will be available during a special two-day hunt held on October 17 and 18, 2009. This managed hunt is available by Refuge permit only.

Hunters must possess a Class A or Class C disabled hunting permit, issued by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, and the appropriate license and stamps. If a large number of applications are received, a drawing will be held. Hunters not selected to participate in the weekend hunt will have the option of reserving a hunting blind on the Refuge on one of six scheduled days following the weekend hunt.

## How To Obtain An Application For A Special Refuge Hunting Permit

### Application Deadlines

**Disabled Waterfowl Hunt:** Applications will be received through **October 2, 2009**.

**Gun Deer Hunt:** Applications will be received **September 7 through October 9, 2009**.

**Archery Deer Hunt:** Applications will be received from **September 7 through December 18, 2009**.

Special Note: This map is for the deer hunt only. It does not illustrate the location of the disabled waterfowl hunt area.
