



Planning Your Visit to the Sacramento National Wildlife Refuge

For your enjoyment and to get the most out of your experience, we need your assistance with the following:

Group Facilitation:

- Wear warm, dry clothes (layers are preferable) and sturdy shoes. During the late fall, winter and early spring it is common to have cold, wet and windy weather.
- Bring and wear mosquito repellent.
- Teachers and parents are responsible for student behaviors and need to supervise students at all times when on the Refuge.
- Students should be wearing nametags; it assists the naturalists in working with the group. Let us know if you need assistance with this.
- Before your visit, divide your class(es) into the appropriate number of groups (2-3) to accommodate the number of activity rotations you have requested.
- Bring garbage bags to pack out your trash and dispose of it at your school.

Auto Tour/Platform:

- The best driving speed is 10-15 miles per hour. Stop at only the two designated Park Stretch Areas or vehicle turnouts so others following may have a good wildlife viewing experience also.
- Ask the students and parents to close car doors quietly and talk softly.
- For your safety, running or climbing on benches and rails is not allowed.
