## Dwight D. Eisenhower National Fish Hatchery Releases for Public Review "Dwight D. Eisenhower National Fish Hatchery Draft Recreational Fish Plan"

Fishing is a traditional use of the National Fish Hatchery System. At Dwight D. Eisenhower National Fish Hatchery (NFH), we welcome people of all backgrounds and abilities to participate in recreational fishing. Dwight D. Eisenhower NFH is seeking public review and comment on its proposed fishing opening. The public is invited to review the draft documents for our proposed fishing program, including the Draft Fishing Plan and Environmental Assessment. These documents will be available for a 45-day comment period. Dwight D. Eisenhower NFH is proposing to:

- Provide opportunities for freshwater fishing on along Furnace Brook from hatchery lands
- Provide opportunities for other non-consumptive recreation on hatchery
- Increase alignment with the Vermont Fish and Wildlife Department and a stronger association between State and Federal land
