

Jaguar Critical Habitat Maps in Google Earth

Instructions for Access

1. Download and install free Google Earth software for Desktop computers (<http://www.google.com/earth/explore/products/desktop.html>) or Android and iOS compatible mobile devices (<http://www.google.com/earth/explore/products/mobile.html>)
2. Go to the Arizona U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services Ecological Services website: www.fws.gov/southwest/es/arizona
3. Click on the link to “Document Library”
4. Click on the link to “Documents by Species”
5. In the “Mammals” section, click on the “Jaguar” link
6. Shortcut website link: www.fws.gov/southwest/es/arizona/jaguar.htm
7. The jaguar documents are arranged chronologically. Scroll down to the March 5, 2014 file labeled “Google Earth kml file: 2014 Final Critical Habitat for the Jaguar (zipped file will open in Google Earth)”
8. Use the “+, -” bar to zoom in and out
9. Use the top compass circle with arrows to align the compass direction and angle of view (from vertical to horizontal)
10. Use the bottom circle with arrows to move around on the map
11. Use the little human figure to get a ground-level view (click on the figure and drag it over to the part of the map you desire to see and drop the figure there)

Those who have ArcGIS Online or ArcGIS ArcMap for Desktop can access the final map version on the same website in a March 5, 2014 document labeled: “Arc GIS Data Files: 2014 Final Critical Habitat for the Jaguar (zipped GeoDatabase shape files)”
