Ritidian: Guam's Forgotten Beauty

The Guam National Wildlife Refuge at *Puntan Litekyan* (Ritidian Point) is located along the northernmost coast of Guam.

To get to the Refuge:

- Access Rte 3 from Marine Corps Drive (Rte 1) or from Andersen AFB Gate (turn right).
- Travel north from Marine Drive or south from Andersen on Rte 3 until you reach Potts Junction at Rte 3A.
- Make a turn at Potts Junction and proceed for 4.5 miles until you reach the Guam NWR sign.
- At GNWR sign, bear left and continue downhill for 1.5 miles to the Refuge gate.
