

**Scope of Work**  
**North Pacific Seabirds Project: Farallon NEPA**  
**Point Blue Conservation Science**

As part of its cooperative agreement with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service – Farallon National Wildlife Refuge (Refuge), Point Blue Conservation Science (Point Blue) has been assisting the Refuge with National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) compliance, including preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for a proposed house mouse eradication project. Point Blue's assistance has included collating and providing scientific data on Farallon Islands' natural resources from their extensive work, collating other useful information, providing technical expertise, reviewing and editing documents, conducting or assisting with collection of baseline data on Farallon wildlife, and conducting studies related to assessing the efficacy or potential impacts of potential eradication techniques.

In order for Point Blue staff to continue to provide the Service with needed assistance on the Farallon mouse eradication NEPA process, funding of \$20,000 is provided by the Service through funds provided by the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation's North Pacific Seabirds initiative. The budget includes salary for the Farallon Program Manager (about 1 month) and Marine Ecology Director (about 0.5 months) and travel (e.g., mileage) to attend meetings.
