DETERMINATION AND FINDINGS
TO SUPPORT THE USE OF THE ECONOMY ACT

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), San Francisco Bay National Wildlife Refuge Complex, requires a study of the potential hazards of the anticoagulants brodifacoum and diphacinone to arboreal salamanders with an estimated value of \$108,274.58. Use of an intra-agency agreement under the authority of the Economy Act is contemplated to obtain the needed goods or services from U.S. Department of Agriculture-APHIS. Having completed the appropriate investigations, we make the following findings pursuant to section 17.503(a) of the Federal Acquisition Regulation:

FINDINGS

1. The supplies or services cannot be obtained as conveniently or economically by contracting directly with a private source.
