To remove and reduce federally listed plant species from lands under Federal jurisdiction and to conduct activities with their parts, the permittee is required to send a notification by email to the applicable Field Office Recovery Permit Coordinator no less than 30 days prior to commencing the activities. Refer to your recovery permit to understand which authorizations apply. Failure to submit this notification may result in the rejection of results, and/or suspension or revocation of the recovery permit.

1. 30-Day Notification

Notifications to remove and reduce federally listed plant species from lands under Federal jurisdiction and to conduct activities with their parts, at the authorized geographic area(s) pursuant to this permit shall be submitted by email to the applicable Field Office Recovery Permit Coordinator at least 30 days *prior* to conducting such activities.

The 30-day Notification (notice) shall include, as appropriate:

- a. An explanation of the purpose of the study and a clear description of methods to be employed, including the names of field personnel, and the number and dates of surveys and/or collection (if applicable), the location of project, and name of the county;
- b. The number of individuals proposed to be collected or reintroduced (if applicable);
- c. A description of the current site and population condition from which collection or where reintroduction will occur, when applicable;
- d. A map (at a minimum, a 7.5-minute U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) topographic map at 1:24,000 scale) depicting the location of the authorized activity. The name of the USGS map shall be identified;
- e. One set of latitude/longitude WGS84 coordinates of the approximate centroid of the area of activity. Multiple centroids may be needed for disjunct areas of activity more than one mile apart or linear areas;
- f. The Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) for the site (if available), the name of the property, and the name of property owner and the respective contact details;
- g. Geographic information system (GIS) data depicting the survey site (if requested); and
- h. The permit number.

After 30 days following the Service's receipt of the notice, the permittee may commence activities authorized by this permit, unless authorization is denied by the Service. New

projects (*i.e.*, tissue or seed collection, collection of parts or seed for propagation), and deviations from the permit conditions must be authorized by the appropriate Field Office Recovery Permit Coordinators via email prior to commencing activities.

If the permittee is denied authorization to conduct the proposed activities, a request for reconsideration may be submitted to the Regional Ecological Services Program Leader for the Pacific Southwest Region at the Pacific Southwest Regional Office: U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Endangered Species Permit Office, 2800 Cottage Way, Room W-2606, Sacramento, CA 95825-1846 (email: permitsR8ES@fws.gov). The procedures specified in 50 CFR 13.29(b) shall be followed.
