Welcome to the Whitefish Point Unit of Seney National Wildlife Refuge

The Whitefish Point Unit of the Seney National Wildlife Refuge is located 80 miles away from the main body of the refuge. This 53-acre tract is known for its concentration of birds during migration. Each year thousands of raptors, perching birds and waterbirds funnel through the point stopping to replenish their energy reserves before or after crossing Lake Superior.

Since its inception, the Whitefish Point Bird Observatory has documented and studied the birds using the point. The data collected by the Observatory has led to the area being recognized as a Globally Important Bird Area for birds migrating between the U.S. and Canada.

Parking and restroom facilities are provided by the Great Lake Shipwreck Historical Society which administers the former Coast Guard buildings, including the lighthouse and gift shop. The Observatory maintains a visitor contact area, bird feeding station and gift shop.

Please keep these ethical wildlife observation tips in mind while visiting the refuge.

- 1. All refuge property at Whitefish Point has been designated as critical habitat for the Endangered piping plover. Please obey all signs and respect beach closures.
- 2. Please leave rocks and driftwood on the beach.
- 3. Drones are not allowed.
- 4. Observe and photograph wildlife without chasing or repeatedly flushing the animal.
- 5. Stay an appropriate distance from nests so the parents are not scared away, leaving the chicks exposed to danger.
- Birds and other wildlife depend on berries and seeds for food. Please harvest wild edibles responsibly.
- 7. Stay on existing trails and pathways to avoid trampling habitat.
- 8. Take all trash with you.
- 9. This list includes birds known to be found on the Whitefish Point Unit and surrounding lands. Primary sources for this list include the Whitefish Point Bird Observatory, Michigan Audubon Society and eBird.
