


TRRP Website History

- Onset of program:
 - Intent to be independent from federal govt.
 - Separate visual identity
 - Content focused on whole program, not just DOI/USBR
- TRRP.NET ... (*not .GOV*)
 - 2004 went live
 - maintained by contractor (ESSA)
- 2007 static copy of 'IIMS'
- 2009 started transition to ODP and more local maintenance

TRRP Website Current Status (Part 1)

- TRRP.NET
 - Dynamic content
 - Easily edited and maintained
 - Automated information pulled from ODP


- Time-Series Data and Graphs

- *Heavily used:*

- 26 GB per month average outgoing bandwidth over last year.*

- Restoration Action Database

- Still not live... about 90% complete
 - Interactive, drill-down information on flows, channel rehab, gravel augmentation, watershed projects





TRRP Website *Changes*

- FY 2014: DOI Foundation Cloud Hosting Services (FCHS)
 - January 2014: “Mandatory Use Policy”
- Our response:
 - Applied for a waiver based on representing a multi-governmental collaboration, not a specific govt. entity
 - Established contacts up to the DOI OCIO to discuss needed flexibility
- This summer, became clear that it was time to be assimilated...
 - but by now, what would have been disaster
 - has become an opportunity!

TRRP Website Opportunities

- Server Operating System will be maintained by DOI contractors for baseline security
- We have flexibility to
 - Build the website applications as we need
 - Manage content as we need
- Puts us more in control than our with our current websites through ESSA
- [Though requires a large chunk of my time for the transition]
- ***Great chance to make improvements!***

TRRP Website – Current Plans

(1-2 year timeframe)

- Cleaner interface
 - One menu system
 - No sidebar
 - Responsive to cell-phone screens
- Organized home page
 - Tabbed content (?)
- Better integration
 - ODP capabilities brought within website
 - Restoration Action Database too
- Better Map Interface
- Better Graphing Interface
- Possibly 3-D point cloud visualization
