

Wings Over Muscatatuck Migratory Bird Festival







The 24th Annual Wings Over Muscatatuck Migratory Bird Festival will be held Friday and Saturday, May 10 and 11, at the Muscatatuck National Wildlife Refuge, in Seymour. Sunday events will be held at the Big Oaks National Wildlife Refuge.

Directions

From Louisville - Take I-65 North to U.S. 50 East (Exit 50A), travel on U.S. 50 east for approximately 3 miles to entrance to the Refuge.

From Indianapolis - Take I-65 South to U.S. 50 East (Exit 50A), travel on U.S. 50 east. Refuge entrance is approximately 3 miles from exit of I-65 on U.S. 50.

From Cincinnati - Travel U.S. 50 west to the Refuge entrance.
