Given that a new JARPA application has been submitted, does that mean that there is opportunity to re-evaluate the appropriateness of using the Nationwide 48 Permit process? As a location that seems to meet the definition of a Special Aquatic Site, it would seem prudent to discuss the value of assessing this application under the Standard Permit process. Also, given that the ability of the Nationwide 48 Permit process to fully address cumulative impacts of marine debris released through aquaculture activities is under review in two pending court cases, our understanding of potential impacts to this Special Aquatic Site has evolved.
