Ralph,

As we discussed today, based on available information the Corps believes the proposed work at Dungeness NWR has potential to cause effects to historic properties subject to protection under the National Historic Protection Act. The Corps has requested a cultural resource assessment to identify historic properties located in the project area.

There are currently discussions between US Fish and Wildlife Service and the Corps on whether either agency will act as federal lead. In any case, the Refuge manager, Jennifer, and I agree completing the cultural resource assessment should move forward as conducting surveys, if required, can be more difficult in the winter high tides.

I have copied this email to the Corps and FWS cultural resource leads and the Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe's archaeologist to facilitate their coordination.
