



Utah Junior Duck Stamp Art Contest

Connecting Children with Nature Through Science & Art



The Junior Duck Stamp Program is a fun engaging way to teach wetland habitat and conservation to students. The contest is open to K-12 public, private, and home school students. After learning about ducks, geese, or swans, students draw, paint, or sketch their favorite species from the eligible North American, Pacific, and Caribbean Island species list.

Artwork is judged in four groups: Grades K-3, 4-6, 7-9, and 10-12. Three 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 16 honorable mention places are selected for each group. Each state selects a "best of show" winner from the 1st place winners, which then competes at the national level.
