Welcome

Fisherman Island and Eastern Shore of Virginia National Wildlife Refuges were established in 1973 and 1984 respectively as an inviolate sanctuary for migratory birds. The refuges' visions are — "Lying at the tip of the Delmarva Peninsula, the Fisherman Island and Eastern Shore of Virginia National Wildlife Refuges are part of a national system of lands managed to ensure the future of wildlife and it's habitats. These refuges serve as one of the country's most valuable stopovers for migratory birds. Nestled between the Atlantic Ocean and Chesapeake Bay, the refuges include a variety of habitats such as martitime forest, shrub thickets, grasslands, beaches, and tidal wetlands. These habitats provide a vital link for millions of songbirds, raptors, shorebirds, and butterflies to rest and refuel before continuing the rigorous journey to their wintering grounds".

Safety

Areas of the refuge may by closed for management purposes, or other hazardous conditions that pose a threat to human health and safety. Fisherman Island is a dynamic island and areas on the map may not represent true ground conditions.

Firearms

Persons possessing, transporting, or carrying firearms on National Wildlife Refuge System lands must comply with all provisions of State and local law. Persons may only use (discharge) firearms in accordance with refuge regulations (50 CFR 27.42 and specific refuge regulations in 50 CFR Part 32).

Firearms and or/muzzleloaders are prohibited in the Archery Only Zone.

Boats

Fisherman, Skidmore and Raccoon Islands are only accessible by boat. You may park your vehicle at the Wise Point Boat Ramp area provided a boat ramp/parking pass is obtained. Parking is limited to first come - first served, obtaining a pass does not quarantee parking will be available.

Dogs

We allow the use of dogs consistent with State and Northampton County regulations only in the General Hunt and Migratory Game Bird Only Hunt Areas.

Hunting Regulations

Hunting regulations are designed to provide safe recreational opportunities through wise use of renewable wildlife resources. Hunting is permitted in accordance with Federal regulations governing public use on National Wildlife Refuges as set forth in Title 50 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

Hunting will be in accordance with applicable State of Virginia regulations subject to the conditions stated herein. Brochures may be obtained by mail, at the refuge headquarters, or from the refuge website.

All members of a hunt party must possess a refuge hunt permit and be actively engaged in hunting. We allow an exception for those persons aiding a disabled person who possesses a valid State-issued Commonwealth of Virginia Disabled Resident Lifetime License or Commonwealth of Virginia Resident Disabled Veteran's Lifetime License.

For Fisherman Island Only

Hunting is only allowed by a boat; you may not hunt from land. Retrieval of fallen game is allowed on land.

Hunting is prohibited from any upland or beach habitat.

Access

Hunters may access the refuge two hours before legal sunrise until two hours after legal sunset.

Hunters must park in designated parking areas to access the refuge for hunting.

Refuge hunt areas adjoin private property and "closed to hunting" areas. It is the hunter's responsibility to know where they are hunting.

Tree Stands & Blinds

We allow the use of portable tree stands, portable blinds and decoys, but you must remove them at the end of each day's hunt.

Prohibited Activities

- By law, recreational activities on national wildlife refuges are prohibited unless expressly permitted
- Possession of alcoholic beverages
- Camping and Fires
- Access to the refuge from private property
- Searching for or removal of any natural items such as antlers, skulls, plants, historic, and archaeological features
- Use of electronic or photographic trail monitoring devices
- Marking or flagging any tree or other Refuge feature with reflectors, paint, or other substance
- Permanent tree stands, nails, screw-in steps, or other items that penetrate the outer bark of a tree
- Night hunting
- Hunting within 100 feet (30.5 meters) of any building, road, or trail, whether improved or unimproved
- Non-toxic ammunition is required for all hunting except for white-tailed deer
- Deer Drives: We define a "deer drive" as an organized or planned effort to pursue, drive, chase, or otherwise frighten or cause deer to move in the direction of any person(s) who is part of the organized or planned hunt and known to be waiting for the deer
