

“Joe and Roberta Before Baskett” Audio File Captions

Speakers include Wildlife Biologists Joe Sands and Roberta Swift, and Public Affairs Officer Lev Levy

Sands: There's birds out here. Or I should put it this way: there has been birds out here at some point in history.

Swift: So, Sheridan...Oh, wow. We're west of Amity now.

Sands: Yeah, we're west of Amity and we're going to kind of circle around. The distribution changes, you know, enough that since I've been out this area in a couple of years.

Levy: So what kind of birds are we seeing if we're not seeing duskys?

Swift: Like right now?

Sands: Right now, we're not seeing any geese.

Swift: I saw some robins. I saw a kestrel. A red-tailed hawk. Harriers. I saw some scrub jays, California scrub jays.
