

“Joe Describes What We’re Seeing at Baskett Slough National Wildlife Refuge” audio file

Speakers include Public Affairs Officer Lev Levy and Wildlife Biologist Joe Sands

Levy: All right, So what are we seeing out here?

Sands: This group is a lot of Taverner’s geese with some cacklers mixed in., which are just another smaller subspecies of cackling goose. The valley has a bunch of different subspecies of geese: two species, Canada goose, cackling goose, and then the subspecies of those.

Levy: So no duskys.

Sands: No dusky that I saw in those. There was one bird down there might have been, but he wasn't red marked and he wasn't like fitting that dusky profile, so we're going to look for a few more. They're not cooperating today as usual.
