**Title:** Draft Species status assessment report for the endangered Lost River sucker and shortnose sucker.

**Description:** All functions of the Endangered Species Program from listing to Section 7 consultation to recovery planning will rely on this document as a basis for synthesizing the status of the species in a rigorous, scientific manner. As such, the Species status assessment (SSA) report will be a living document upon which many other documents such as listing rules, recovery plans, and 5-year reviews will be based.

## About the Peer Review Process

**Type of review:** Letters

**Anticipated Number of Reviewers:** minimum of three (3)

**Reviewer Selection Method:** Pacific Southwest Service staff not party to the Klamath Sucker SSA Team will select Peer reviewers. We will select reviewers who are unlikely to experience personal gain or loss as a result of the Service's decision. Peer reviewers will not be compensated for their time, and Service employees will not be used for this peer review.

**Expertise needed in the Peer Review:** The Service will solicit reviews and comments from subject area experts who are willing to commit to providing an objective written scientific review of the draft SSA report within the needed time frame. Selections of peer reviewers will be based on their knowledge and expertise of the two species and their habitat, including biology, conservation, and ecology. They will include field biologists that are familiar with the area where the species occurs.

**Estimated Peer Review Timeframe:** June 2018 to August 2018

**Will the public and/or scientific or professional societies be asked to nominate peer reviewers?** No
