In accordance with its role as an affected bureau in the Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill Natural Resource Damage Assessment and Restoration (NRDAR) case and settlement, National Park Service (NPS) WASO, Regional, and park staff have reviewed the Regionwide Trustee Implementation Group's "Draft Restoration Plan/Environmental Assessment 1: *Birds, Marine Mammals, Oysters, and Sea Turtles*" (Draft RP/EA1) and provided input into its development. Based on their review of this document, I find that it adequately addresses potential impacts to NPS resources.
