Subject: No Coastal Barrier Restoration Act Consistency Determination Required for two (2) Projects in the Mississippi Trustee Implementation Group's Restoration Plan #3

We used the Coastal Barrier Resources System (CBRS) mapper (<https://www.fws.gov/cbra/maps-and-data> [accessed May 20, 2022]) to determine if two (2) proposed projects in the Mississippi Trustee Implementation Group's Alabama Restoration Plan #3 are located within any CBRS Units or any Otherwise Protected Areas (OPA). Public comment for this plan closed on January 6, 2022. As the proposed actions occur outside of any CBRS Units and are not within any OPAs, no additional analysis was developed. The projects are listed below in Table 1.
