The Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) has reviewed the Alabama TIG funding proposal titled “Oyster Grow-Out and Restoration Reef Placement – 5 Year Continuation”, in Alabama, submitted by Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. Our comments are provided in accordance with provisions of the Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act (48 Stat. 401, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 661 et seq.) and the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (87 Stat. 884, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.).

Based on the information provided in your biological evaluation and the conservations proposed, we concur with your determination that the proposed project “may effect, but is not likely to adversely affect” the eastern black rail (*Laterallus jamaicensis* ssp. *jamaicensis*), and West Indian manatee (*Trichecus manatus*).
