Only zoological parks, scientific or educational institutions, and museums that meet the definition of "public" under 50 CFR 10.12 are eligible for this permit (50 CFR 22.21) and must complete section B on page 1 of this application. A minimum of 12 public educational programs per year must be conducted under this permit. If eagles are on display in an exhibit for educational purposes, you must be open to the public for a minimum of 400 hours per year. You must be at least 18 years old to apply for a migratory bird permit. Please read "Frequently Asked Questions" before you sign and submit your application.
