Condit Experiential Learning Project

The goal of this project was to provide a science-based, locally relevant, experiential education program focused on removal of Condit Dam. Learning opportunities included: field trips, in-class presentations, water quality monitoring, habitat surveys, habitat restoration, Condit Dam informational booth at community events, library art show and displays. The grant culminated with an "Opening of the White Salmon River" parade during the White Salmon Art and Wine Fusion, July 2012. The large salmon (seen to the right, during the parade) was an art project by a local White Salmon high school student. This effort was funded by a Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Fund grant in partnership with Yakama Nation Fisheries Program and Mid-Columbia Fisheries Enhancement Group.

Archery as an Outreach Tool!

June 2012...both the Information and Education Manager and Assistant attended the National Conservation Training Center sponsored training for archery. Archery as an outreach tool is an outdoor conservation program focusing on interactions with people and wildlife. It teaches students how to interact with the natural world by developing basic skills of archery. It also teaches an appreciation of what is around them and enhances their encounters with the outdoors. Both ladies are certified Basic Archery Instructor Trainers as part of the National Archery in the Schools Program. They will incorporate archery into local school physical education programs, work with special interest groups to provide archery opportunities and also offer archery events at the hatcheries.



Schoolyard Habitat Update

A Confluence Project grant funded the creation of a Salmon Water Fountain located in the Native Pollinator Garden at Whitson Elementary School, White Salmon, WA. The fountain theme is salmon and their interconnectedness to everything. It was an all school project that involved our office, local artists and community members.



Outdoor Learning:

- **Bass Lake Field Day** Kindergarten students from Whitson Elementary learn about stream, meadow and forest habitats in this unique opportunity offered in partnership with U.S. Army Corps of Engineers rangers.
- **Camp Wa-Ri-Ki** 5th graders from Carson Elementary gather for an overnight experience & learn about forest, meadow & stream habitats.
- **Water Jam** Students who participated in Salmon in the Classroom culminate their salmon unit with an extraordinary outdoor day of learning. Many partners make this unique opportunity a reality. The day is complete with a concert by Recycle Man and the Dumpster Divers.



- **Camp Cowabunga** 2nd graders from Whitson Elementary experience all facets of the outdoors: pollinators, ethno-botany, and a unique nature walk.
- **Conboy Lake NWR Field Day** 2nd graders from Whitson Elementary join our staff for an outdoor day of hiking and learning at the refuge. Students focus on pollinators and sharpen their sensory skills looking and listening for wildlife and learning about different refuge habitats.
