A New Curriculum Aimed at Students in Grades 3-6 to Study Interaction of Plants and Pollinators is Launched

The North American Pollinator Protection Campaign's Pollinator Partnership™ has launched a new curriculum aimed at students in grades 3-6 to study the interactions of plants and pollinators. [Nature's Partners: Pollinators, Plants and You](#) is comprised of seven modules. Each module offers three or four activities designed to engage young people in active, investigative science following a learning cycle of exploration, concept introduction/development and concept application.

The activities are appropriate for the formal classroom or for a nonformal education setting and can easily be adapted to fit the needs of the students and the teaching situation.

The Pollinator Partnership™ is a project of the North American Pollinator Protection Campaign (NAPPC), which is coordinated by the non-profit Coevolution Institute (CoE). The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has partnered with the CoE and NAPPC to protect pollinators by raising the profile of pollinator issues.
