New Jersey

Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge

- The Wildlife Drive in Galloway remains closed.
- The Songbird Trail, including the portion that uses Wildlife Drive will be closed December 10 through 14 due to a refuge hunt.
- Other hiking trails in Galloway are open from 9a.m. to 4p.m. including the Akers Woodland Trail, Leed's Eco-trail, and foot access to Gull Pond Tower.
- The visitor information center is open from 10a.m. to 3p.m. weekdays and 9a.m. to 4p.m. weekends.
- All fees have been temporarily waived.
- Scott's Landing boat launch is open.
- Barnegat Observation Platform is open.
- The deCamp Wildlife Trail in Brick Township is open for the first 2000 feet.
- The Holgate Unit remains closed.

Virginia

Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge

- The refuge is open daily from 6a.m. to 6p.m .
- Temporary repairs have been completed on Beach Road and it opened to all vehicle traffic Saturday, December 1st.
- Approximately 100 parking spaces have been created in parking lot 2.
- Most of the refuge trails will open, including the Wildlife Loop, Marsh Trail, Lighthouse Trail, Black Duck Trail, Woodland Trail and Swans Cove Trail.
- The Wildlife Loop Trail is open to vehicle access from 3p.m. to 5p.m.
- The Over-Sand Vehicle (OSV) Zone is open.
- The refuge visitor center and Toms Cove visitor center will be open from 9a.m. – 4p.m.
