Dear Stakeholder,

RE: KZN LION METAPOPOPULATION MANAGEMENT – RECOGNISED PROPERTY.

The management of lion populations within KwaZulu-Natal is guided by the nationally approved Biodiversity Management Plan (BMP) for the species. This BMP defines three types of lion populations, viz: Wild, Managed Wild and Captive, with populations within KwaZulu-Natal falling within the Managed Wild category (fenced reserves <math><1\ 000\text{km}^2/100\ 000\text{ha}</math>).

In ensuring that the management of these populations is sustainable and contributes to the conservation efforts of the species, Ezemvelo KwaZulu-Natal Wildlife has implemented a metapopulation management approach for the province. KwaZulu Private Game Reserve (KPGR) is one of the properties whose population is considered to be Managed Wild. They have submitted a management return for the individuals on their property dating back to 2010, in which the *inter alia* births, deaths, offtakes and introductions are supplied. This data is utilised to ensure that populations are managed in accordance with the metapopulation principles adopted for KwaZulu-Natal. In ensuring that the metapopulation principles are maintained within the province, all permit applications for introductions are thoroughly scrutinised to ensure that no captive animals are brought into the province. This includes background checks into the properties from which any intended animals are applied for.

As a result of such, Ezemvelo KwaZulu-Natal Wildlife permitted the hunting of two adult male lions on KPGR during 2019. Based on the age of the individuals, these offtakes simulate the natural deaths of older males.



RESERVE LION HUNTING POLICY**



11 January 2017

To whom it may concern

Application for an import permit for a lion trophy to the United States of America.

Included herein are the details relating to the origin of the trophy, game reserve where the animal will be hunted and their lion management policy.

KwaZulu Private Game Reserve (KZPGR) is 180km² that is 18 000ha and is located in the north-east of KwaZulu-Natal Province in South Africa. KZPGR. The neighboring community comprises of low-skilled individuals whose unemployment rate currently is very high. The income generated from the reserves goes toward the various community projects. The reserve maintains the local school's lawn and assist with food on an ad hoc basis. In addition KZPGR supplies four communities surrounding the reserve with water from time to time, as well as firewood and river sand on a weekly basis. Our employees who are not residing on the farm are being transported to and from their residence on a daily basis. These are all costly exercises and the income of some of the lions covers these costs. The reserve also employs 82 people from the local community and therefore support approximately 200 families.

KZPGR has two main income streams, one is eco-tourism from guests staying at the 5 star Lodge and the other is hunting. The reserve does not receive any financial support from the Government and therefore have to generate income to cover the high running costs associated with managing a game reserve. Hunting contributes to the reserve's operational costs and approximately 30% of the funds raised through hunting goes back into wildlife management and security. The income does not only support the predator management but also other species such as rhino which are currently under serious threat from poaching.

All the animals roam free on the 18 000ha reserve and the lions hunt for themselves and there is no feeding of predators involved. All hunting takes place on the basis of fair chase. The first lions were introduced in 2004 from Phinda Resource Reserve and Madikwe Game Reserve (wild populations) to enhance the eco-tourism product as well as sustainable utilization through hunting of selected animals. Genetic management of small populations is critical to maintain genetic heterozygosity and therefore removals

and introduction of new genetics form part of KZPGR's lion management plan. All the animals introduced come from wild populations.


Miss Karen Holmes is the wildlife ecologist contracted to advise on all aspects relating to wildlife and habitat management. The reserve has an anti-poaching team responsible for the protection of all wildlife which comes at high cost to the company. Dr. Mike Toft is the attending wildlife veterinarian and is responsible for all the, testing, translocation and veterinary work required. In addition to all the management and security costs the reserve had to incur huge costs in order to dehorn the entire rhino population. This will be an ongoing expense and therefore balancing the budget is becoming more and more challenging. KZPGR rely heavily on the income from hunting in order to sustain the reserves running costs.

KZPGR has a certificate of adequate enclosure as well as a predator management plan approved by the Ezemvelo KZN Wildlife, the provincial conservation authority. All permit requirements, provincial, national and international are complied with.

Please find attached US Fish & Wildlife permit application as well as the hunting permit issued by Ezemvelo KZN Wildlife, the provincial conservation authority. The Department of Environmental Affairs will only issue the export permit once the recipient country has issued the import permit.


