Lake Ilo National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) lies in gently rolling, mixed grass prairie in a semi-arid region. It is an oasis for many species of wildlife. The Refuge was established in 1939 after the Federal government built a dam near the confluence of Spring and Murphy creeks creating 1,240-acre Lake Ilo. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service manages the land for a diversity of wildlife, with emphasis on migratory birds. The grasslands, planted forested areas, Lake Ilo, and numerous smaller wetlands provide habitat for many species of animals.

Lake Ilo NWR is one of over 530 refuges in the National Wildlife Refuge System – a network of lands set aside specifically for wildlife. Managed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Refuge System is a living heritage, conserving wildlife and habitat for people today and for generations to come.

Checklist

This checklist includes all wildlife species seen on the Refuge: 227 birds, 36 mammals, 6 reptiles, 3 amphibians, and 11 fish species. All bird species names are in accordance with the *American Ornithologists' Union, 1998. Check-list of North American Birds. 7th ed. Am. Ornithol. Union, Washington, D.C.*

Bird species listed as "Accidentals" have been sighted only a few times. They are found at the end of the common bird name list. Since most birds are migratory, their seasonal occurrence and relative abundance are coded as follows:
