

Leavenworth National Fish Hatchery (LNFH) was built in 1940, and was the largest fish hatchery in the world at that time. Along with Entiat and Winthrop national fish hatcheries, LNFH mitigates the impact of the Grand Coulee Dam on salmon and steelhead. LNFH currently raises 1.2 million spring Chinook salmon every year for release, supporting tribal, sport, and commercial fisheries. The hatchery is a National Historic Landmark. Located just two miles from main street Leavenworth, Washington's popular "Bavarian village," the hatchery serves as a de facto community park. An estimated 100,000 visitors each year enjoy the 170-acre site, with over five miles of wooded trails, an award-winning pollinator garden, and a visitor center open year-round. The Wenatchee River Salmon Festival has been hosted here in September since 1990.

Fishing Opportunities Near Leavenworth National Fish Hatchery



1 Blackbird Island Pond

Open to 14 yr. & under, seniors, & disabled
Rainbow trout, westslope cutthroat

No amenities

Head east on US-2, after .8 mi turn right onto
9th St., then Mill St., left on Main St. to parking
lot. Pond accessible via footpaths.

2 Lake Wenatchee

Kokanee, westslope cutthroat trout, rainbow
trout, mountain whitefish



Head west on US-2 W, after 14.2 mi. right onto
WA-207 N, after 3.6 mi left on Cedar Brae Rd.,
right after .3 mi. to State Park Road for south
shore access. For north shore access, stay on
WA 207-N for 4.6 mi.

3 Fish Lake

Rainbow trout, yellow perch, kokanee,
westslope cutthroat trout



Located one mile NW of Lake Wenatchee on
WA 207.

4 Rock Island Ponds Complex

(Hideaway, Big Bow, Pit, Putters, and
Hammond lakes)

Rainbow trout, bluegill, largemouth bass,
pumpkinseed, carp, channel catfish

From hatchery, right onto Icicle Road for 2.2
mi. Turn right onto US-2 to Wenatchee, after
21.5 mi. turn right onto WA-28 E, follow 5.1
mi., turn left onto Rock Island Rd.
