Final Programmatic Report
September 23, 1999

The response to this course was overwhelming. 104 people registered and attended. Over 40 people who wanted to attend were put on a waiting list for the next course, which will be held in February in the Stockton area. Project staff worked closely with the consultant TetraTech to initiate mailings and publicity, process registrations, make logistical arrangements, and generally prepare for the course.

Course attendees were an excellent mix of resource agencies representatives, local government representatives, environmental engineering firms, and people involved with grassroots resource planning (please see attached list of course attendees). People from as far away as West Virginia and Vermont attended. (A gentleman from Egypt was in contact with project staff. Unfortunately he had to cancel.)

During the course, local publicity was generated, resulting in two television news spots, and even more people wanting to be put on the mailing list.
