

# Known Northern Long-eared Bat Hibernacula and Roost Trees in Iowa

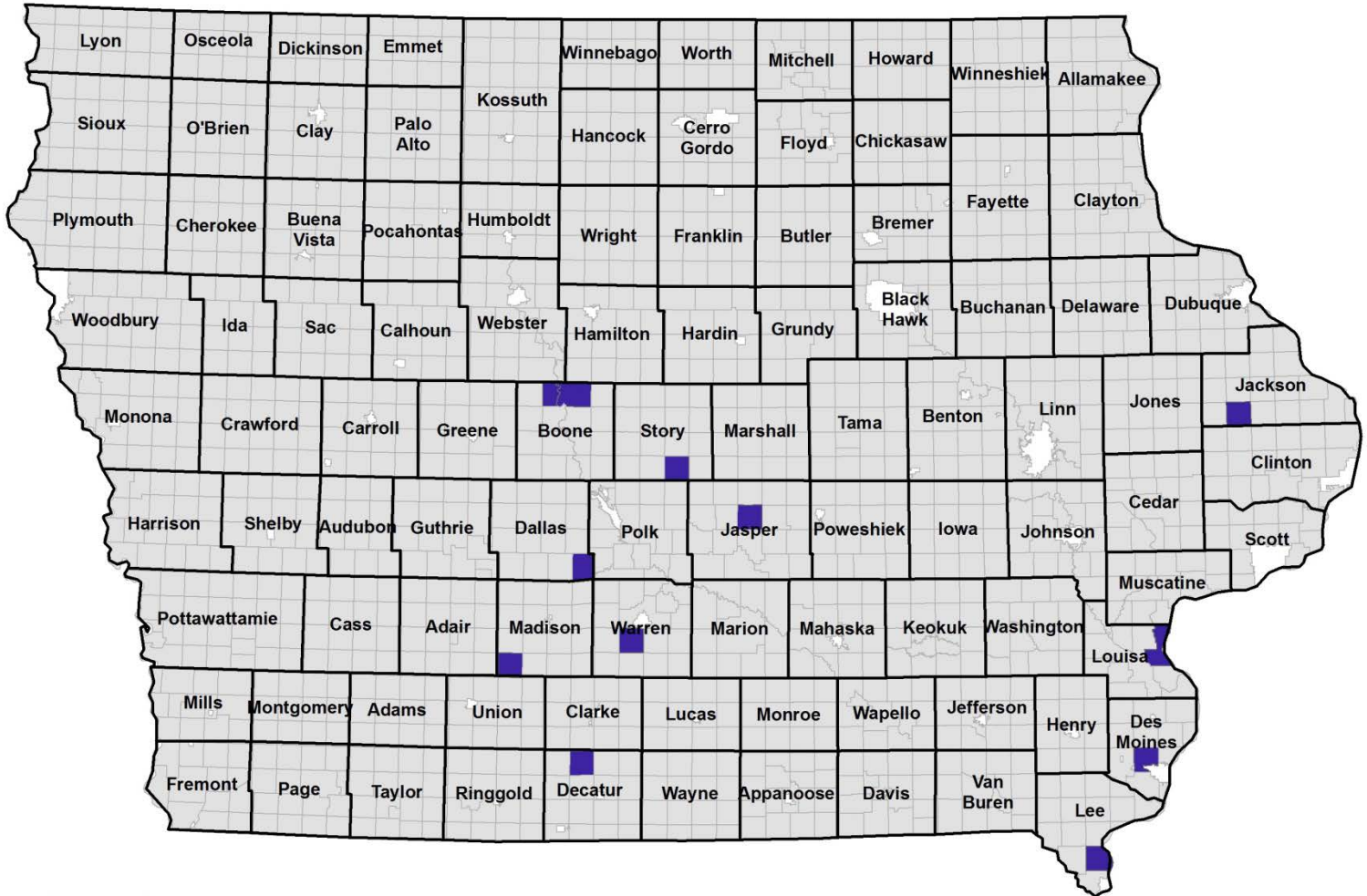

- Iowa is completely within the Northern Long-eared Bat (NLEB) range, and nearly entirely in the White-Nose Syndrome Zone (excepting one county).
- The final 4(d) rule for the NLEB provides procedures to protect this species in areas affected by white-nose syndrome.
- Below are the townships and counties within Iowa that contain at least one NLEB roost tree or hibernacula.
- This list will be updated as new information becomes available.
