

## Summer Job Opportunities 2012 Youth Conservation Corps Positions with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service

### Location(s):

Pendills Creek National Fish Hatchery, Chippewa County, Michigan  
Neosho National Fish Hatchery, Neosho, Missouri  
Jordan River National Fish Hatchery, Antrim County, Michigan  
Iron River National Fish Hatchery, Iron River, Wisconsin  
Genoa National Fish Hatchery, Genoa, Wisconsin

**Typical Duties:** The Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) Program introduces young adults, 15-18 years of age, to work experiences and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. This summer, YCC members will assist hatchery personnel with:

- General grounds maintenance
- Trail maintenance and visitor access projects
- General fish culture and hatchery operation
- Painting and building maintenance

**Schedule and Salary:** YCC Crew Members work Monday through Friday, 40 hours per week, from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. between June and August. Some flexibility in scheduling is possible with permission. Salary is \$7.25 - \$7.40/hour .



**Eligibility and Selection:** The YCC Program is open to young adults, 15-18 years old. Applicants must be citizens of the United States and have a social security number. No previous experience is required. Selection is by random drawing. **Application Deadline:** Applications must be received (or postmarked) by **April 15, 2011** to be considered. Please include a short resume of work experience or skills.

**How to Apply:** Complete the attached application or an application may be picked up at the National Fish Hatchery 8:00 am and 3:00 pm or at your school office.

**YCC Program Expectations:** By submitting an application, you agree to comply with the following expectations of employment. Failure to do so will be grounds for termination. YCC Crew Members:

- Are REQUIRED to wear the provided uniform and safety equipment at all times as directed by the supervisor.
- Will be to work on time and ready for daily assignments.
- Will follow instructions given by supervisors.
- Will participate in all aspects of the program, including outreach and education programs.
- Will contribute their best to the success of the program.

**Physical Demands and Hazards:** The job will require hard work in an outdoor setting. Physical demands and environmental hazards may include:

- Use of hand tools such as shovels, rakes, wheelbarrows.
- Lifting up to 50 pounds of weight repetitively
- Digging, pulling, and bending.
- Work on rough terrain
- Exposure to insects, sun, and wind

**The Student's Experience:** The Youth Conservation Corp isn't just about work, it's about building a future for yourself and the nation. While working on projects you will learn: 1) How your work benefits the hatchery, fisheries resources, and the public. 2) About the benefits, the history and the heritage of natural resource conservation. 3) About the role National Fish Hatcheries play in all Midwest Region fisheries programs .
