On behalf of the Midwest Region, Office of Law Enforcement, of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service), I would like to inform you of our upcoming regional office move that will take place over the Memorial Day 2011 weekend. Our last day in our current location will be Friday, May 27th. Beginning on Tuesday, May 31st, the Service's Midwest regional office will be relocated to the Norman Point II Office Building, at the following address:

Our office has been housed within the Bishop Henry Whipple Federal Building, located at 1 Federal Drive, Fort Snelling, Minnesota for several years. The Service and other tenants will be vacating the building so that it can undergo significant structural and energy upgrades. Planned construction and renovation to the Whipple Building, which is being funded by the *American Recovery and Reinvestment Act*, is expected to take several years to complete. As the Service will not be returning to the Whipple Building after construction is completed, our current plan is to remain at Norman Pointe II.
