North American Wetlands Conservation Act Reporting Requirements

This document fulfills the requirements of Sections 10 and 16 of the North American Wetlands Conservation Act of 1989.

Sec. 10. REPORT TO CONGRESS.

The Secretary shall report to the appropriate Committees on the implementation of this Act. The report shall include—

- (1) a biennial assessment of—
 - (A) the estimated number of acres of wetlands and habitat for waterfowl and other migratory birds that were restored, protected, or enhanced during such two-year period by Federal, State, and local agencies and other entities in the United States, Canada, and Mexico;
 - (B) trends in the populations size and distribution of North American migratory birds;
 - (C) the status of efforts to establish agreements with nations in the western hemisphere pursuant to section 16; and
 - (D) wetlands conservation projects funded under this Act, listed and identified by type, conservation mechanism (such as acquisition, easement, or lease), location, and duration.
- (2) an annual assessment of the status of wetlands conservation projects, including an accounting of expenditures by Federal, State, and other United States entities, and expenditures by Canadian and Mexican sources to carry out these projects.

Sec. 16. OTHER AGREEMENTS.

- (a) The Secretary shall undertake with the appropriate officials of nations in the western hemisphere to establish agreements, modeled after the [North American Waterfowl Management] Plan or the [Tripartite] Agreement, for the protection of migratory birds identified in section 13(a)(5) of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act of 1980 (16 U.S.C. 2912(a)). When any such agreements are reached, the Secretary shall make recommendations to the appropriate Committees on legislation necessary to implement the agreements.

Migratory Bird Trends [Section 10(1)(B)]

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, in conjunction with states, the Canadian Wildlife Service, provincial governments, and other partners, conducts breeding-ground surveys annually to estimate the size of duck breeding populations. Specialized surveys track trends in the populations of other harvested migratory species, such as the mourning dove and the American woodcock. We use the North American Breeding Bird Survey, conducted on approximately 2,900 routes in the United States and Canada by thousands of volunteers, to monitor changes in the distribution and abundance of many other migratory bird species that use wetlands and associated habitats.

Wetland numbers and conditions at the time of the breeding-ground survey were excellent in the U.S. prairies, with an estimate for the north-central region of 2.9 million ponds in 2010 and 3.2 million ponds in 2011; the average estimate was 1.6 million ponds from 1974 to 2010. With some exceptions (e.g., fair to poor conditions were observed in the parklands and boreal forests of Alberta), wetland conditions were good to excellent across the entire survey region in 2011. The total estimate for the U.S. and Canadian prairies was 8.1 million ponds in 2011. This estimate was 22 percent above the 2010 estimate of 6.7 million ponds and 62 percent above the long-term average of 5 million ponds.

The estimate of mallard abundance was 9.2 million individuals in 2011, which was 9 percent above the 2010 estimate of 8.4 million individuals and 22 percent above the long-term average of 7.5 million individuals. The gadwall abundance estimate was 3.3 million individuals in 2011, which was similar to the 2010 estimate and 80 percent above the long-term average of 1.8 million individuals. Estimated abundance was 2.1 million individuals for the American wigeon, which was 14 percent below the 2010 estimate of 2.4 million individuals and 20 percent below the long-term average of 2.6 million individuals. In 2011, the estimate of green-winged teal abundance was 2.9 million individuals, 17 percent below the 2010 estimate of 3.5 million individuals, but 47 percent above the long-term average of 2.0 million individuals. Blue-winged teal estimated abundance was 8.9 million individuals in 2011, 41 percent higher than the 2010 estimate of 6.3 million individuals and 91 percent higher than the long-term average of 4.7 million individuals. For northern pintails in 2011, estimated abundance was 4.4 million individuals, which was 26 percent above the 2010 estimate of 3.5 million individuals but similar to the long-term average. The estimate of abundance for the northern shoveler was 4.6 million individuals in 2011, 14 percent above the 2010 estimate of 4.1 million individuals and 98 percent above the long-term average of 2.3 million individuals. Redhead abundance estimate was 1.4 million individuals in 2011, 27 percent above the 2010 estimate of 1.1 million individuals and 106 percent above the long-term average of 0.7 million individuals. The estimated abundance of 0.7 million individuals for the canvasback was similar to that of 2010, but 21 percent above the long-term average of 0.6 million individuals. Estimated abundance for the two scaup species combined was 4.3 million individuals, which was similar to that of 2010, but 15 percent below the long-term average of 5.1 million individuals. Excluding scoters, eiders, long-tailed ducks, mergansers, and wood ducks, the estimate of total abundance for ducks was 45.6 million individuals in 2011, an 11 percent increase over the 2010 estimate of 40.9 million individuals, and 35 percent higher than the long-term average of 33.8 million individuals.

Primary abundance estimates decreased by 10 percent for seven and increased by 10 percent for ten goose populations in 2010-2011. Populations of Mississippi Flyway giant, Atlantic and Aleutian Canada geese; western Arctic/Wrangell Island snow geese, and Pacific white-fronted geese all showed positive ten-year trends. Abundance estimates for tundra swan western population showed no trend, but the eastern population showed a negative ten-year trend. The dusky Canada goose population remains a concern, with a trend averaging 3 percent/year; however, the 2011 spring population estimate of 11,800 dusky Canada goose was 24 percent higher than the 2010 estimate of 9,500 individuals. Aleutian Canada geese, which were listed as endangered in 1967, increased an average of 3 percent per year; the estimate for 2011 is well above the 1996 estimate of 20,700 individuals. Estimates of the mid-continent white-fronted geese population increased by 22 percent from 583,200 individuals in 2010 to 709,800 individuals in 2011. Some goose populations (e.g., temperate-nesting Canada geese, greater and lesser snow geese, and Ross's geese) continued to be overabundant in 2010-2011.

The mourning dove call-count survey has been running for 46 years in the Eastern, Central, and Western Management Units (EMU, CMU, and WMU). From 1966–2011, there was a trend of 0.4 percent/year for the number of



doves heard per route in hunting states of the EMU. However, during the same period, there was a trend of 1.1 percent per year for the number of doves heard per route in non-hunting states and for the number of doves seen per route in hunting and non-hunting states of the EMU. The survey data also showed long-term negative trends for the number of doves heard per route and the number of doves seen per route in the CMU (heard 0.8 percent, seen 1.4 percent) and WMU (heard 0.3 percent, seen 1.5 percent). Two-year and ten-year trends were highly variable for doves heard and seen in hunting and non-hunting states of the EMU. Negative trends were detected for doves heard in 2010-2011 (5.9 percent) and 2002-2011 (1.2 percent) in the CMU; but the evidence for two-year and 10-year trends for doves seen was inconclusive. A 10-year trend of 2.3 percent was detected for doves heard in the WMU, but there was inconclusive evidence for the two-year trend of doves heard and for the two-year and 10-year trends of doves seen in this management unit.



In 2010 and 2011, breeding population indices derived through the American Woodcock Singing-Ground Survey did not change in the Eastern and Central Management Regions. There was no trend for woodcocks heard in the Eastern and Central Management regions in 2001-2011. However, both management regions showed trends of about 1 percent per year in 1968-2011. The 2010 woodcock recruitment index for the U.S. portion of the Eastern Management Region was 1.2 percent higher than the 2009 index, but was 10.2 percent below the long-term average. In 2010, the recruitment index of the U.S. portion of the Central Management Region was 30.2 percent higher than the 2009 index, but still 2.1 percent lower than the long-term regional index.

Trends of other migratory bird species varied widely. Of all species groups, grassland birds have exhibited the most consistent negative trends since the late 1960s. Presently, 48 percent of grassland nesting species are of conservation concern, including four endangered populations. Negative population trends have been associated with the extensive loss and degradation of grassland habitats mostly because of conversion to agriculture. Restoration of native grasses and planting of dense-nesting cover under the North American Waterfowl Management Plan, funded through the North American Wetlands Conservation Act, has produced positive effects on the density of breeding birds and their reproductive success in the Prairie Pothole Region. These and other programs, such as the Conservation Reserve Program and Partners in Flight, are of critical importance for species of conservation concern.

About 21 percent of wetland/open-water-dependent migratory bird species showed increasing and about 16 percent showed decreasing long-term population trends. However, data from the North American Breeding Bird Survey are scant for many of these species, and conclusions about trends should be viewed with caution.

Throughout North America there were significant decreasing trends for about 39 percent of species breeding in successional or scrub habitats; while about 29 percent of species breeding in woodland habitats showed significant increasing trends in 1966-2009. However, 37 species that breed in woodland habitats exhibited significant long-term decreasing population trends. Populations of about 67 percent of species breeding in urban habitats have significantly decreased since 1966, while about 33 percent of urban-nesting species have significantly increased across North America.

The above species groups contain short-distance migrants and Neotropical migrants. Short-distance migrants breed and winter north of the U.S.-Mexico border, while Neotropical migrants winter south of the border. In certain areas where the number of short-distance migrant species is highest, such as the northeast United States, Great Lakes states, and the Canadian prairie, negative population trends predominate for this group. In all, about 42 percent of these species exhibited significant decreasing trends. Regional population trends of Neotropical migrants are complex and patterns are difficult to discern. Yet 41 percent of Neotropical migrant species have shown significant negative trends since the late 1960s.

For many species, the extent to which population trends are driven by the destruction and degradation of wintering habitats south of the United States is unknown. However, experts believe habitat loss south of the U.S. border is contributing to the decline of some of these species. International cooperation is needed to assure the conservation of habitats used by migratory birds throughout their annual cycles. Through continental programs such as the North American Waterfowl Management Plan and North American Wetlands Conservation Act grant program, we can foster international cooperation for the conservation of migratory birds and their habitats.



U.S. NAWCA Grant Project Highlights

San Luis Valley Rio Grande Initiative Phase III

Grantee: Rio Grande Headwaters Land Trust
Launched in 2007, the San Luis Valley Rio Grande Initiative is a collaborative, community-based effort to conserve the area's riparian corridor, associated wetlands and senior water rights. With a grant of \$1,000,000 and matching funds of \$3,281,850, the initiative expanded permanent land protection around core wetland conservation areas through acquisition of four river corridor conservation easements, protecting 1,875 acres of private land, including 844 wetland acres and four river miles of the Rio Grande. To date, more than 22,000 acres have been protected through this initiative.

Teton Basin Phase V

Grantee: Teton Regional Land Trust
Objectives of this project, phase five in an ongoing effort, were to conserve and restore key wetland and associated upland habitats, and address a key element for increasing waterfowl nesting: restoring and protecting highly functional upland habitat in proximity to protected wetlands. With a grant of \$1,000,000 and matching funds of \$3,394,327, project partners protected and restored wetlands and uplands that provide valuable nesting, migration and wintering habitat for priority wetland birds such as the long-billed curlew, sandhill crane and trumpeter swan and waterfowl such as mallard and wigeon.

Great Marsh Habitat Protection

Grantee: Massachusetts Audubon Society

With a grant of \$1,000,000 and matching funds of \$2,116,000, the Massachusetts Audubon Society and its partners in the Great Marsh Habitat Protection project acquired and protected more than 200 acres of salt marsh and upland buffer in the middle of the 25,000-acre Great Marsh ecosystem, the largest salt marsh complex in New England and the largest salt marsh on the eastern seaboard north of Long Island. Grant and match parcels provide critical, high-quality habitat for numerous bird species of conservation priority, as well as federally and state-listed threatened and endangered species.

With a grant of \$1,000,000 and matching funds of \$3,243,798, Ducks Unlimited and its partners protected and/or enhanced four sites of important wetland, associated upland and riparian habitats.

The North American Wetlands Conservation Council

The North American Wetlands Conservation Act established the North American Wetlands Conservation Council, comprising nine voting members who review and recommend grant funding for wetland protection and restoration projects in the United States, Canada and Mexico. The Council provides recommendations to the Migratory Bird Conservation Commission, which provides final funding approval for these projects.

The Council has been widely viewed as a leader in international habitat conservation activities through its implementation of the Act.

The Director of the Fish and Wildlife Service, the Executive Director of the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, and ex-officio members representing the governments of Canada and Mexico are permanent members of the NAWCC, and are not included in this list.

The Migratory Bird Conservation Commission was established in 1929 with the passage of the Migratory Bird Conservation Act to consider and approve any areas of land and/or water recommended for acquisition or lease by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. In addition to approving purchase and lease prices, the Commission considers the establishment of new waterfowl refuges. In 1989, the Commission acquired the additional responsibility of approving grant project funding under the North American Wetlands Conservation Act.


