Update on HCPs that are being developed for areas in which there are wintering mountain plovers:

Solano County HCP. Although an HCP is currently being developed for Solano County, the mountain plover is not currently covered by the HCP.

Yolo County HCP. An HCP is underway, but has not yet been completed for this county. Specifics of coverage for the Mt. Plover are not finalized at this time.
