Project Title: Construction of Outdoor Campus West Regional Facilities

PURPOSE

The purpose of this narrative is to propose the construction of Regional facilities at the Outdoor Campus West property in Rapid City, South Dakota. These facilities include a regional shop, research lab, cold storage building, hunter education center, casting pier, and a boat wash station.

NEED

New Regional facilities are needed to accommodate Regional staff needs. The current office location in Rapid City is not conducive to the everyday needs by land management staff, fisheries staff and game staff. The current facility is cramped in space. Many staff share offices in order to keep from spilling into the small lab, conference room and other office facilities. Equipment used by land and fisheries staff are scattered around the Region due to lack of storage facilities. A new regional shop, lab and cold storage is needed to provide more space to carry out our everyday land, game, and fisheries management activities.

OBJECTIVES

By December 31, 2011

1. Construct a Regional shop facility, research lab, and cold storage building.
2. Construct a Hunter Education Center.
3. Construct a Casting Pier.
4. Construct a Boat Wash Station.

RESULTS AND BENEFITS

The construction of a Regional shop facility in Rapid City will provide a centralized location for maintaining machinery, boats, trucks and other equipment needed to carry out day to day management.

The construction of a large cold storage building will provide a centralized location for storing machinery, fisheries boats, and equipment. One major benefit to having an enclosed cold storage building is that it reduces the amount of wear and tear on machinery, boats, and equipment by storing them out of the seasonal weather.

The construction of a new Research Lab will provide an up to date ventilation system and sufficient space for dealing with big game, small game, and fish.

The Hunter Education Center will be an outdoor archery range set-up with a small storage building to store targets, bows, and other equipment for hunter education and bow hunter education classes, as well as providing archery shooting opportunity to anyone interested in the sport.

The Casting Pier will be used for educating children and adults in regular casting and fly fishing casts. This will be used in aquatic education courses, clinics, and for interested individuals or families wanting to learn the basics of fishing.

The Boat Wash Station will be a high pressure washer used to keep boats clean before being placed into other bodies of water, which will help prevent the spread of invasive species.

APPROACH

All facilities will be advertised and bid out through a competitive bidding process as required by South Dakota law. The engineering was completed through a certified engineering firm. Building plans for the shop, cold storage building, and research lab can be found in **Appendix A**.

Useful Life - The shop, research lab and cold storage building will have a useful life of 25 years. The Hunter Education Center will have a useful life of 15 years. The casting pier will have a useful life of 15 years. The boat wash station will have a useful life of 10 years.

Regional shop facility - The estimated amount of use of the shop by the habitat staff and the fisheries staff will be estimated at: 66% habitat and game; 17% fisheries and 17% law enforcement. Only the habitat, game, and fisheries components will be covered by this grant.

Research Lab - The estimated amount of use by the wildlife management staff and the fisheries staff will be estimated at 70% wildlife and 30% fisheries.

Cold Storage Building - The estimated amount of use will be estimated at 30% habitat/game, 50% fisheries, and 20% law enforcement. Only the habitat, game and fisheries components will be covered by this grant.

Hunter Education Center will be constructed separate from the shop complex. It will be closer to the main Outdoor Campus Educational facility. This will be more conducive for visitors to use the Hunter Education Center.

Casting Pier – The pier will be constructed by the contractor awarded the bid, adjacent to the Outdoor Campus Educational facility.

Boat Wash Station will be constructed in the shop complex area. The shop complex will be gated off from the public.

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LOCATION

Legal Description – See Attached Map in **Appendix B**.

ESTIMATED COSTS

The estimated cost for the Regional Shop facility is \$1,700,000. The shop will be used by habitat/land crews, fisheries staff, and law enforcement. The estimated amount of use by the habitat staff and the fisheries staff will be estimated at: 66% habitat and game; 17% fisheries and 17% law enforcement. Excluding \$289,000 for the law enforcement use, the remaining amount eligible for this grant is \$1,411,000, which will be \$1,122,000 PR and \$289,000 DJ.

The estimated cost for the Cold storage building is \$650,000. The storage building will be used by habitat, game and fisheries staff, as well as law enforcement. The estimated amount of use will be estimated at 30% habitat/game, 50% fisheries, and 20% law enforcement. Excluding \$130,000 for the law enforcement use, the remaining amount eligible for this grant is \$520,000, which will be \$146,250 PR and \$243,750 DJ.

The estimated cost for the Research Lab is \$550,000. The lab will be used by wildlife management staff and fisheries staff. The estimated amount of use by the wildlife management staff and the fisheries staff will be estimated at 70% wildlife and 30% fisheries.

The estimated cost of the Hunter Education Center is \$85,000.

The estimated cost of the Casting Pier is \$50,000.

The estimated cost of the Boat Wash Station is \$10,000.

LAND CONTROL

The Department of Game, Fish and Parks purchased this property in fee title solely for the purpose of constructing the Outdoor Campus West facility.

RELATION TO OTHER FEDERAL PROJECTS

Projects at the Outdoor Campus West facility will include some Hunter Education (W-96-E and W-142-E) and Aquatic Education (F-45-E) eligible activities. The Regional Headquarters Shop area will support, directly and indirectly, the following projects: Land Management (W-81-D), Fisheries Survey activities (F-21-R), Fisheries Research (F-15-R), Wildlife Research (W-75-R), and Wildlife Surveys (W-95-R).

PRIME/UNIQUE FARMLAND

The proposed activities will have no impact on prime or unique farmland, as the soils present are not prime farmland.

FLOODPLAINS/WETLANDS

The proposed activities will have no impact on floodplains or wetlands.

ENDANGERED SPECIES

Species Considered

Whooping crane, Topeka shiner, Eskimo curlew, piping plover, interior least tern, American burying beetle, gray wolf, pallid sturgeon, black-footed ferret, western prairie fringed orchid, lynx, scaleshell mussel, Dakota skipper, Higgins Eye Pearlymussel, and Ute ladies-tresses.

No populations of federally listed species are known to exist on the project area. The Outdoor Campus facilities will be constructed in an area that is heavily developed. Bordering two sides of the property are residential areas. On side of the property is a cement plant, which is separated from the project area by a major street/highway.

However, if any endangered or threatened species appear on or adjacent to the work site, all work will be stopped until potential impacts can be addressed.

Consultation letter can be found in **Appendix C**.

ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

This project involves the construction of new, or the addition of small structures or improvements, including structures and improvements for the restoration of wetland, riparian, instream, or native habitats, which result in no or only minor changes in the use of the affected local area. Therefore, this project qualifies as a categorical exclusion from the NEPA process as described in the Department of Interior Manual, Part 516, Chapter 8, Section 8.5, B(3), dated May 27, 2004.

This proposal does not have significant adverse effects on public health or safety.

This proposal does not have significant adverse effects on such natural resources and unique geographic characteristics as historic or cultural resources; park, recreation or refuge lands; wilderness areas; wild or scenic rivers; national natural landmarks; sole or principal drinking water aquifers; prime farmlands; wetlands (Executive Order 11990); floodplains (Executive Order 11988); national monuments; migratory birds (Executive Order 13186); and other ecologically significant or critical areas under Federal ownership or jurisdiction.

This proposal does not have highly controversial environmental effects or involve unresolved conflicts concerning alternative uses of available resources [NEPA Section 102(2)(E)].

This proposal does not have highly uncertain and potentially significant environmental effects or involve unique or unknown environmental risks.

This proposal does not have a precedent for future action or represent a decision in principle about future actions with potentially significant environmental effects.

This proposal does not have a direct relationship to other actions with individually insignificant but cumulatively significant environmental effects.

This proposal does not have significant adverse effects on properties listed or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places as determined by either the bureau or office, the State Historic Preservation Officer, the Tribal Historic Preservation Officer, the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, or a consulting party under 36 CFR 800.

This proposal does not have significant adverse effects on species listed, or proposed to be listed, on the List of Endangered or Threatened Species, or have significant adverse effects on designated Critical Habitat for these species.

This proposal does not have the possibility of violating a Federal law, or a State, local, or tribal law or requirement imposed for the protection of the environment.

This proposal does not have the possibility for a disproportionately high and adverse effect on low income or minority populations (Executive Order 12898).

This proposal does not have the possibility to limit access to and ceremonial use of Indian sacred sites on Federal lands by Indian religious practitioners or significantly adversely affect the physical integrity of such sacred sites (Executive Order 13007).

HISTORICAL/CULTURAL RESOURCES

Section 106 consultation letters were sent to the SHPO and nine tribal governments that have expressed interest in the Department's statewide development activities. At the request of the SHPO, a Level III Cultural Resources survey was done for the entire property. No cultural resources were discovered. A copy of the consultation documents are attached in **Appendix D**.

ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE (EXECUTIVE ORDER 12898)

This project will have no impact on environmental justice issues

INVASIVE SPECIES (EXECUTIVE ORDER 13112)

The proposed work will not promote the spread of invasive species within the project area.




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
Storage plan


4 EAST ELEVATION




5 BUILDING SECTION





The Wildlife Division is proposing to use federal funds to construct a shop and research lab, cold storage building, boat wash station, casting pier and a Hunter Education Center for archery shooting at the Outdoor Campus West site location. A map is attached.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the above referenced project pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (as amended). The South Dakota Office of the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) concurs with your determination regarding the effect of the proposed undertaking on the non-renewable cultural resources of South Dakota.

We have made this consensus determination based on the information provided in your letter and the report entitled "An Intensive Cultural Resource Survey of the South Dakota Department of Game, Fish and Parks Rapid City Outdoor Campus Site, Rapid City, Pennington County, South Dakota," prepared by Terri Bruce and James A. Donohue and received on October 5, 2009. We concur with the determination of No Historic Properties Affected for this undertaking as no historic properties as defined by 36 CFR part 800.16(l) were located during the survey of the project area. Activities occurring in areas not identified in your request will require the submission of additional documentation pursuant to 36 CFR part 800.4.

This project will be funded with Wildlife Restoration and Sport Fish Restoration Federal Aid Program funds, as administered by the US Fish and Wildlife Service.

Outdoor Campus West, Pennington Co. -

This project will involve the construction of an education center and offices, as well as a shop for equipment storage, and parking. Project components that are eligible for federal funding include the shop and some educational facilities inside the main campus building. Educational kiosks may also qualify for federal money.

This project will have no negative visual impact upon the project area; this project will provide some positive aesthetics. The site originally had a couple of buildings on the property, but the prior landowner removed those buildings. The site is adjacent to the gravel pit and cement plant complex.
