NEW ALASKA GAME COMMISSION
APPOINTED BY SECRETARY JARDINE

Secretary of Agriculture Jardine has announced the appointments of the newly authorized Alaska Game Commission, with Charles T. Gardner, Juneau, as commissioner for the first Judicial Division of Alaska; Thomas D. Jensen, Nome, for the second; Dr. Will H. Chase, Cordova, for the third; and Dr. Preston S. Whitney, Fairbanks, for the fourth division. These commissioners, with Ernest P. Walker, representing the Bureau of Biological Survey, as executive officer and fifth member of the Commission, will have their headquarters at Juneau, the Territorial capitol. Under the Alaska Game Law, approved January 13, 1925, which supersedes all laws now in effect in the Territory relating to Alaskan game and land fur-bearing animals, this commission is authorized to employ and discharge game wardens, and otherwise administer the provisions of the law. Under this new law the taking or possessing of all wild animals and birds is prohibited, except in accordance with regulations to be promulgated by the Secretary of Agriculture after conference with or on recommendation of the commission.
