EXPECT EARLY TRIAL
OF MARKET GUNNERS



Early trial of two men arrested in Louisiana for shooting 190 coots and two ducks out-of-season is expected by the Bureau of Biological Survey, it was announced today. The case is now in the hands of the U. S. District Attorney for trial in the Federal court.

The men were arrested near Raceland, La., October 27, by a Federal deputy game warden, and were identified as market gunners. After spending two days in jail they were released on bond pending the setting of date for trial.

The hunting season for waterfowl, coot, and snipe in Louisiana did not open until November 2 and ends on January 6 at sunset. During this time shooting is permitted on only three days a week, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.
