The 1945 revision of the directory of all organizations and officials concerned with the protection of wildlife, including fishes, is now available in printed form, Albert M. Day, acting director, Fish and Wildlife Service, United States Department of the Interior, has announced.

This circular, forty-second in the series issued since 1900, was compiled by Samuel Robinson of the Service's Division of Game Management, and is designed to meet the needs of officials charged with the administration and enforcement of fish and game laws. It is also convenient for the use of persons desiring to communicate with officials and organizations concerning wildlife conditions in the several States and Territories, the Canadian Provinces and Territories, Newfoundland, Mexico, the West Indies, Central America, and South America.
