



A new \$3 duck stamp is issued each year by the Post Office Department, which is in charge of distribution and sale. The 1963-64 stamp will go on sale July 1, 1963, and expires June 30, 1964. Every person who has attained the age of 16 and who hunts migratory waterfowl is required to carry a stamp. The stamp is not valid unless the name of the hunter is written across its face. The duck stamp is required in addition to a State hunting license.

All revenue from the sale of the stamps, other than funds needed to reimburse the Post Office Department for the actual cost of printing and distribution, is used in selecting and acquiring migratory bird areas under the provisions of the Migratory Bird Conservation Act. Normally more than two million stamps are sold annually.
