SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR APPOINTS TWO FISHERY ADVISORS

Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udall today announced the appointment of Jack Gorby, San Diego, Calif., and Arthur H. Frohman, Chicago, Ill., to the American Fisheries Advisory Committee.

The Committee, composed of 20 key United States fishing industry representatives, was established in 1955 under provisions of the Saltonstall-Kennedy Act to advise the Secretary of the Interior on general fisheries matters.

Mr. Gorby is an executive with the Westgate-California Corporation of San Diego. He is an engineer with many years' association with the California fish canning industry. Mr. Gorby previously was president of the California Marine Packing and Curing Company, a subsidiary of the Westgate-California Corporation. He is also a former president of the Tuna Research Foundation.

Mr. Gorby replaces Milton Fillius, San Diego, who resigned after serving one year on the Committee.

Since 1935, Mr. Frohman has been associated with the food brokerage firm of L. H. Frohman and Sons, Inc., a major merchandiser of seafoods. He is a member of the National Fisheries Institute, American Seafood Distributors Association, Seafood Club of Chicago, Chicago Food Brokers Association, National Food Brokers Association, and the Chicago Institutional Marketing Club.

Mr. Frohman replaces Ralph Carr, Kansas City, Mo., who retired from the Committee after serving six years.
