FREDERICK WHITE NAMED ASSISTANT DIRECTOR FOR
ADMINISTRATION IN U.S. FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE

The appointment of Frederick N. White, Jr., 38, as Assistant Director for Administration in Interior's U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service was announced today.

As the Service's business manager, White will be responsible for a wide variety of support services including personnel, safety, finance and accounting, contracting, data processing, correspondence, publications mailing, and for insuring that the Service complies with all legal, regulatory, and policy requirements in conducting its work.

White comes to Interior from the U.S. Coast Guard in the Department of Transportation, where he has worked in various capacities since joining the Federal service in July 1967. Since April 1970 he has been Chief of the Coast Guard's Mission Support Section, Information Systems Division.

Before beginning Federal service, he worked as a computer systems analyst with an insurance company and as a computer systems analyst and project manager with several companies in the scientific and technical information field.

He was graduated from Temple University in 1958 with a B.S. in Industrial Management and Business.

A native of Philadelphia, he is married to the former Joan N. Scharas, also of Philadelphia. They have two daughters, Kimberly, 10, and Karen, 6, and live in Rockville, Md.
