JOIN THE JUNIOR RIVER RANGER PROGRAM! Twenty-nine miles of the Sudbury, Assabet and Concord Rivers have been designated as National Wild & Scenic Rivers. The rivers flow through local communities, Minuteman National Historical Park and the Great Meadows National Wildlife Refuge. The Wild and Scenic Rivers program is managed by the National Park Service.

The National Park Service has established a Junior River Ranger program geared for children ages 9 - 12, however all ages are welcome! The goal is to present young learners with a fun way to learn about the significant role our waterways play throughout the country and especially at the local level.

A Junior River Ranger activity booklet has been developed which introduces a number of tasks the children will tackle. Upon completion of these activities each child earns the title of Junior River Ranger and a Junior River Ranger Badge

Booklets can be obtained from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service at the Assabet River NWR visitor center located at 680 Hudson Road, Sudbury, MA on Thurs - Sun, 10am - 4pm, and the Great Meadows NWR office at 73 Weir Hill Road, Sudbury, MA on Mon - Fri, 8am - 4pm. Completed booklets can also be dropped off at these locations. The activities are self-directed under parental supervision.
