Learn how to fly-cast, spin-cast, and even tie your own fly. All equipment and instruction will be provided. We will have games, crafts, music and face painting as well.

**10am -noon: Wildlife: Up Close and Personal** Join Mass Audubon's Drumlin Farm naturalist for some family fun. Visit with native wildlife, birds and reptiles that live along the banks of the river and depend on a healthy habitat.

**2pm - 5pm: Alien Attack!** Join Refuge staff on the Sudbury River and help us combat the attack of the invasive water chestnut! This is a great opportunity to get out on the river and make a difference for wildlife.
