The saltmarsh sparrow is the only bird to nest and winter exclusively in the Eastern US. They live every aspect of their lives in salt marshes.




A RACE AGAINST THE TIDE

A female sparrow builds nests, broods eggs, and feeds chicks, all by herself.



Mom brings food back to the nest 50 times a day



Mom builds nest and lays 4 eggs

RISING WATERS

As seas rise, the marsh floods higher, longer, and more frequently.

Nests flood more often.



Sparrows can build nests higher or use marshes that migrate inland.

But they need our help.

Elevated houses and roads allow water and sediment to flood marshes, helping marshes to keep apace with rising seas.

Natural lands adjacent to salt marshes allow marshes to move inland.
